Anthony Goicolea Troy Makaza Ittah Yoda



For its next participation at the Armory Show, Galerie Poggi is pleased to present an overview of contemporary painting. Mixing young and more established artists, the booth is divided into three sections, allowing each artist - Troy Makaza, Ittah Yoda, and Anthony Goicolea - to develop their discourse with works specifically made for the fair.

Anthony Goicolea

Born in 1971 in Atlanta, Georgia, Anthony Goicolea is a first-generation Cuban American artist now living and working in Brooklyn, New York. Employing a variety of media, Goicolea explores themes ranging from personal history and identity, to cultural tradition and heritage, to alienation and displacement.

Whether in his photographs, for which he gained quick recognition in the 2000s, or his paintings, to which he has been fully dedicated since 2019, Anthony Goicolea's works bear witness to a slightly distorted and disturbing reality. Their strangeness, or even absurdity, and sometimes anachronism, are not necessarily revealed at first glance, giving them a dreamlike, even mythological dimension. Drawing from his personal history or that of his family who fled Cuba when Fidel Castro came to power, Goicolea depicts the fragility and resilience of characters who are often solitary, whom he represents in ambiguous situations that call into question their identity, their gender, or their social and cultural alienation.

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For the Armory Show, Galerie Poggi will present a new body of paintings and works on Mylar by Goicolea.

Anthony Goicolea has participated in numerous group and solo exhibitions in the United States, Canada, Europe and Asia, including the **Museum of Contemporary Photography** (Chicago, IL), the **Corcoran Gallery of Art** (Washington, D.C.), the International Center of Photography (New York City, NY), the **Groninger Museum** (Groningen, NL) and also the Museo Nacional Centro de Arte Reina Sofia (Madrid, ESP).


The works of Goicolea are part of many public collections, including those of the **Whitney Museum** of American Art, the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and the Museum of Modern Art (New York City, NY), as well as those of the **Yale University Art** Collection (New Haven, CT), the North Carolina **Museum of Art** (Raleigh, NC) and the **Telfair** Museums (Savannah, GA).



Troy Makaza

Born and living in Harare, Troy Makaza is one of the most unique Zimbabwean voices of the past decade. Throughout his glossy, tactile and surrealist wall works made of silicone infused with pigment, resonating with traditional modes such as weaving and tapestry, Makaza explores what the African and specifically Zimbabwean contemporary can be today : a paradigm both internationally appealing and locally compelling.

Troy Makaza's work defies any formal categorization and thus conceptualizes a reconciliation of divergent cultural, historical, and political ideologies in Zimbabwe and around the world. Makaza's work remains playful and light-hearted, subtly referring to popular visual culture, traditional Zimbabwean symbolism, local food and art history to create synthetic agglomerations where colors, shapes and textures play an aesthetic and symbolic role.

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Now one of the leading figures on the emerging scene in South Africa and Zimbabwe, Makaza will be a part of the group that will **represent Zimbabwe at** the next International Art Exhibition of La **Biennale di Venezia in April 2024.**

He won the **2019 Investec Cape Town Art Fair Tomorrows/Today Award** and his work has been exhibited in London, Milan, Al Maaden Museum of **Contemporary African Art in Marrakech**, Vestfossen Kunstlaboratorium in Norway, Evergold Projects in San Franscisco, and in fair presentations at Art Basel Miami Beach, Paris+ by Art Basel, Frieze no.9 Cork Street, Art Joburg and ARCOmadrid.

The Galerie held his first solo show in France in April 2023.

Ittah Yoda

Placed within Le Monde's most promising artists of **2022**, Ittah Yoda will present for the second time in the Armory Show a new series of paintings based on their research on zooplankton linked to forms from virtual reality they have been developing for several years. This hybridization between recent and older research states creates a genealogy in all their practice; each work is linked to a global approach, like a natural ecosystem. Furthermore, this series of paintings was realized in close complicity with Michael Woolworth, integrating processes of lithographic impression.

Ittah Yoda joined the Galerie Poggi in January 2022, which holds **their first solo exhibition in Spring 2023**, alongside several group and solo exhibitions at the **Centre Culturel Jean Cocteau in Les Lilas** (FR), the Musée des Beaux Arts d'Angers (FR) and the **Centre International d'Art et du Paysage (FR)**.










